The **Sea** symbolises the Depth of Knowledge in the College.

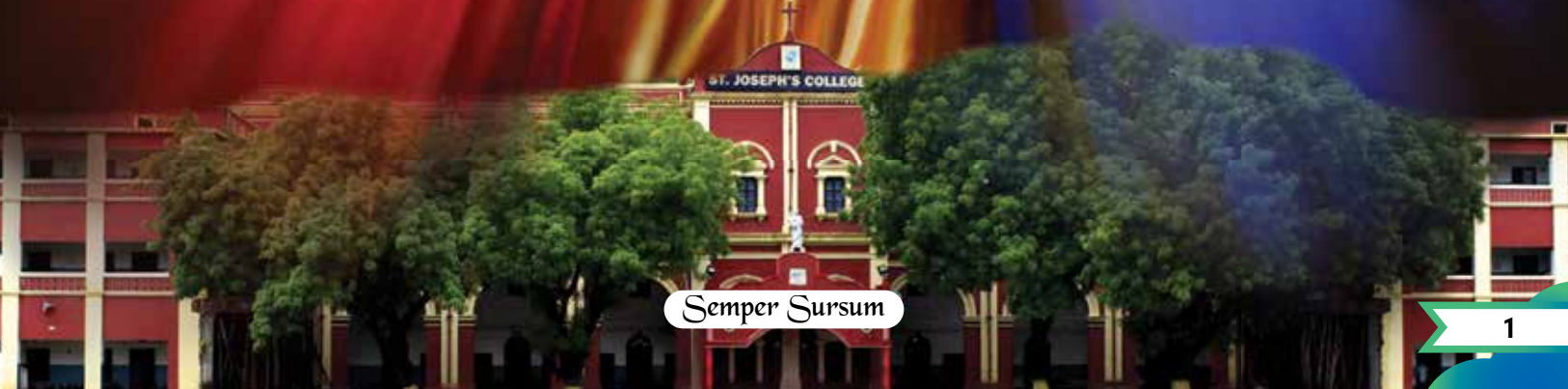
The **Eagle** symbolises the Height of Knowledge right to the zenith.

हिंदी साहित्य समिति

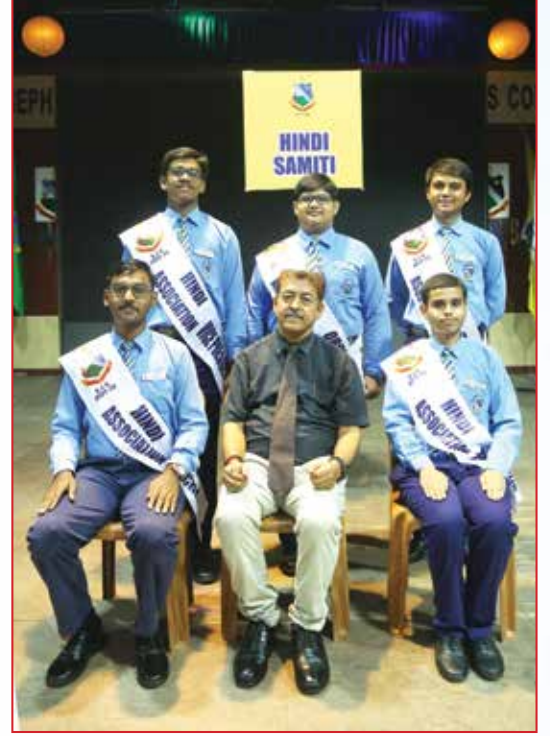

The Football Season at SJC kicked off in May with the *Summer Camp* which commenced after a hiatus of 2 years due to the Pandemic. The Principal, Rev. Fr. Thomas Kumar addressed the enthusiastic ballers on the *Opening Day* with an inspiring speech, followed by several weeks of intense training. Sweat and tears were shed on SJC ground by players from all classes. New talents were discovered, fitness levels were improved and a sense of discipline and team work was developed in the hearts of our budding Josephites as we concluded an eventful Summer season with around a hundred students completing the Training Camp under the guidance of our coaches.

Following the hard work in training, it was now time to prepare ourselves for the most anticipated football tournament : *The Challengers' Cup Football Tournament, 2022*. The *Inaugural Ceremony* was held on the 21st of June, 2022 at SJC ground. The Ceremony was made all the more special by the presence of the Chief Guest, Rev. Fr. Ronald Noronha, the Director of Sadhna Sadan, the Principal, Rev. Fr. Thomas Kumar, the Headmaster, Rev. Fr. George Medepalli, the Staff Coordinator, Mr. J. Dube and the Sports Coordinator, Mr. S. Rafique. The Ceremony started at 6:30 a.m. with the Mistress of Ceremony, Mrs. M. D'Souza welcoming and introducing the Chief Guest who then declared the Tournament '*Open*'. Four teams went head-to-head in the Tournament trying to bring glory to each of their schools. They comprised of Bishop Johnson's School & College, Prayagraj, Kendriya Vidyalaya New Cantt., Prayagraj, Army Public School, New Cantt., Prayagraj and St. Joseph's College, Prayagraj.

First up to the task was Bishop Johnson's School's vastly dynamic team but eventually, St. Joseph's College would emerge victorious after a nail-biting encounter between the two sides which went into a tie-breaker where SJC won by a score of 6 - 5. The heroics of our goalkeepers Shriyash Pandey and Pranav Pillai proved to be too much even for BJS. The first Match enlightened us as to where tactical alterations and stability were needed. Our 2nd Match was against a strong Army Public School, New Cantt., Prayagraj but persevering and determined as we were, we quickly overwhelmed their defence with 2 goals early on in the 1st half, and the Game ended with our Team winning 5 goals to 1. Ahmed Mustafa, Aseem Rai, and Praveen Soni were instrumental in the attack whereas Aditya Chaurasia and Srijan Malviya were rock solid at the back. Our Final League Game was against KV New Cantt in which our boys performed extraordinarily well beating the opponents by 4 goals to 1. The Midfielding of Ayush Purswani, Pavitra Bhargav and Pranav Pillai dominated the Game from start to finish. Sai Anjeney controlled the left-hand side and barred all counterattacks.

The *Closing Ceremony* of the *Challenger's Cup Football Tournament* began on the 24th of June, 2022 with the welcoming of the Chief Guest, Mr. Danish Ahmad with the Principal of SJC, Rev. Fr. Thomas Kumar and the Headmaster, Rev. Fr. George Medepalli. With high spirits and a hunger to win, we entered the Final Match against Bishop Johnson's School & College. BJS had also improved as the Tournament progressed and found the back of the net in the first half. Pavitra Bhargav equalised the score brilliantly in the final minute of the Game with a header to force a tie-breaker, and yet again Pranav Pillai proved his worth by saving 2 penalties. Our spot kick takers did not miss as we won by a score of 5-3 and lifted the prestigious *Challengers' Cup Tournament, 2022 Winners' Trophy*. The



Chief Guest congratulated all irrespective of their winning status and declared the Challengers' Cup Tournament 2022 'Closed'.

The Clinical striker Praveen Soni won the Top Scorer Award.

Later on in the *Inter Class Football Tournament*, the underdogs Class VI emerged as the Winners in the Junior Category. It was followed by an eagerly awaited Match between Class X and XII herein Aman Wig opened the scoring as his effort went in the top corner. Srijan Malviya's long-range effort had a similar outcome as he unleashed a venomous attempt from 30 yards. Praveen Soni sealed off the victory for Class XII as the Match ended in 3-0, and Srijan Malviya was declared the *Man of the Match*. The Final Match was played between Classes XII and XI and yet again Praveen Soni's brace capped off a solid display and he was declared the *Man of the Match*. Hence Class XII were winners in the Senior Category. The Inter Class Tournament was followed by the *Inter House Tournament* in which Gold House emerged victorious and the Red House secured the Runners Up spot. The Blue House showed resilience as they finished Third and the Green House finished Fourth.

The judges for the Competition were Sr. Alice, Mr. Vaibhav Phillips and Ms. Aditi Bhatia.

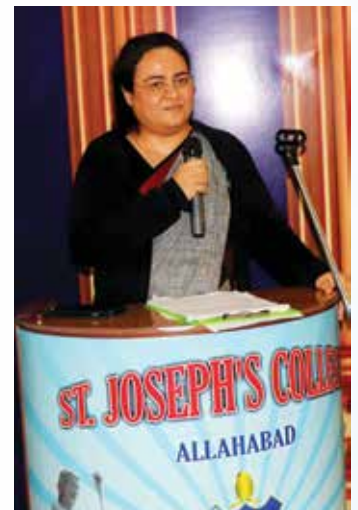

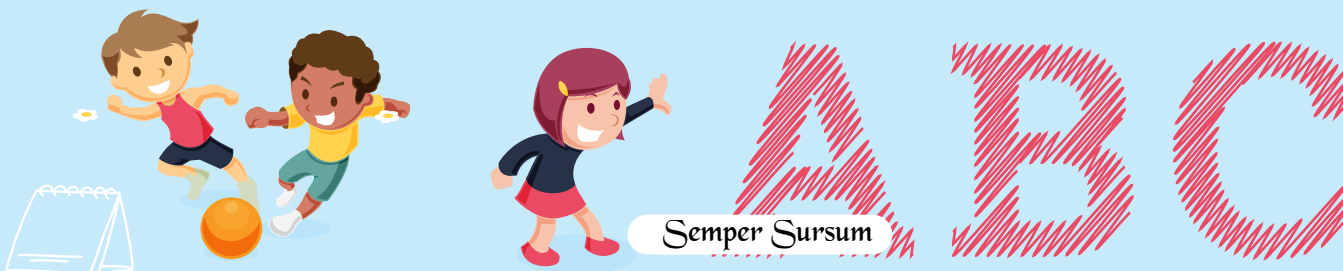

Motivating students to join the Indian Air Force

It was only fitting that a College which has the former Air Chief Marshal, Mr. N. A. K. Browne as one of its alumni as well as many others on highly coveted positions in the Defense, should motivate the present generation to “*touch the sky with glory*” which is also the motto of the Indian Air Force.

The three distinguished guests for the day were welcomed by the Vice Head Prefect, Aman Wig as they were ushered in by the Principal, Rev. Fr. Thomas Kumar, the Additional Administrator, Mr. A. McGowan and the Staff Coordinator, Mr. J. Dube. The Vice Head Marshal, Devaansh Goswamy introduced the guests for the day, Squadron Leader Rakesh Kumar, Master Warrant Officer S. K. Shukla and Corporal Kuldeep Bisht to the gathering. The Principal, Rev. Fr. Thomas Kumar florally welcomed the Chief Guest and the other Guests of Honour.

The Chief Guest then made the students aware of the various career options available in the Indian Air Force, be it fighter pilots, technical support or ground personnel. He also drew attention to the sterling qualities of IAF officers and the various perks they enjoy while having the honour of serving the nation. The College witnessed a very illuminating session by the three Air Force officers.

An insightful Power Point Presentation was then made which was then followed by a *Question and Answer Session*. The Staff Coordinator, Mr. J. Science is the torch that illuminates the path of progress for Humanity. The amenities of the modern world are a product of the scientific method of inquiry into the happenings of the world. It has helped humanity get past many of its natural constraints and to surge forward into the future. It is thus important to ingrain within the students the spirit of scientific inquiry from a young age. On the 14th of October, 2022, the Science Association of St. Joseph’s College, Prayagraj organised a *Science Exhibition* for the students from Classes VI to XII.

The models were supplemented with slide show presentations on laptops. The highlight of the venue was the exhibit titled “*Iron Man Mk II*”, a hydraulic forearm exoskeleton complete with an acetylene flamethrower.

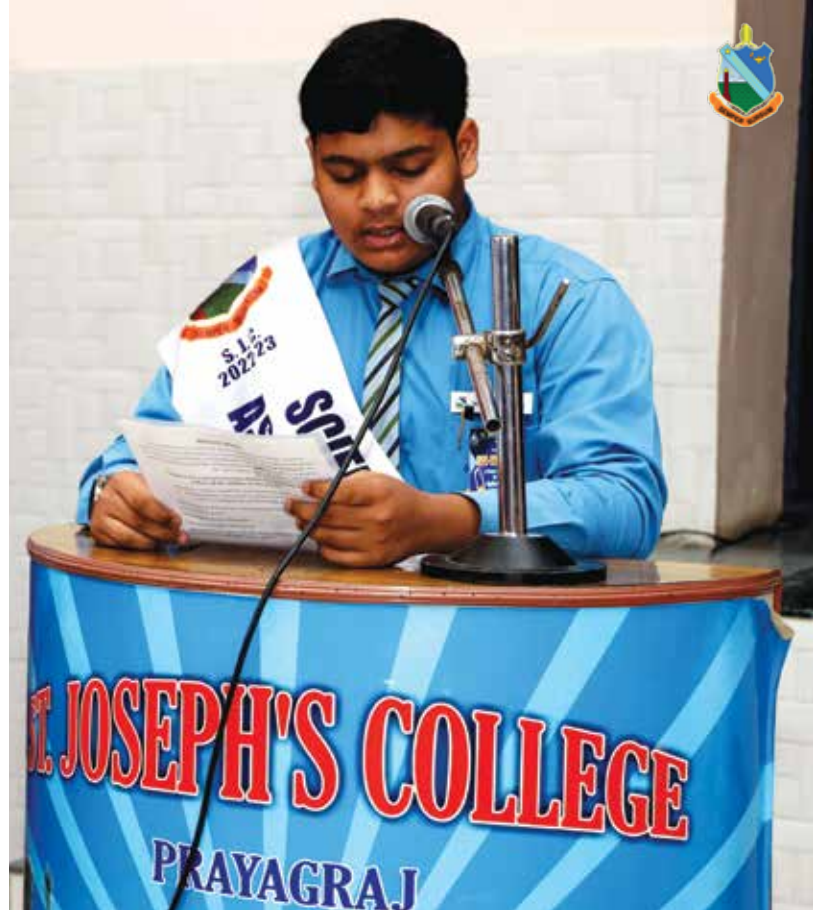
The Reading Room was where all the exhibits related to Chemistry were displayed. The general theme of all the exhibits was the various kinds of pollution and measures to curb them. One of the attractions was a working Water Filter made out of different kinds of cloth and fibres.

The subject of the exhibits in the Physics Laboratory ranged from hydroelectric power, models to models of DC motors, the Solar System as well as a working model of a dam. The highlight was a homemade, fully functional Clinometer which received great admiration from the judges.

The exhibits in the Biology Laboratory were models of human organs, systems and the human anatomy, and various other topics related to the subject of Life Sciences.

After the judging of the Exhibition, the judges were felicitated with mementoes by the General Secretary of Science Association, Ashutosh Maurya.

This was followed by the Vote of Thanks presented by the Organising Secretary of the Science Association, Syed Ahmed Abbas Hasan which then brought the Exhibition to its conclusion.

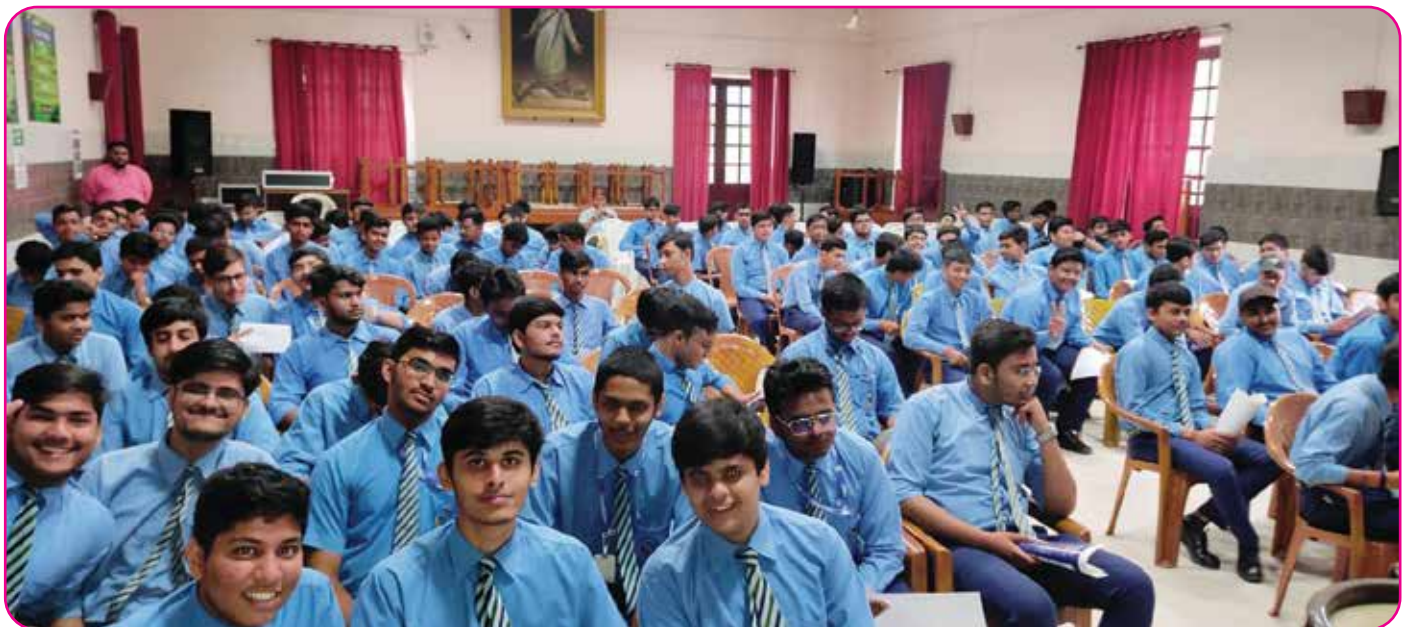






CLAT Seminar

FRIENDSHIP DAY CELEBRATIONS

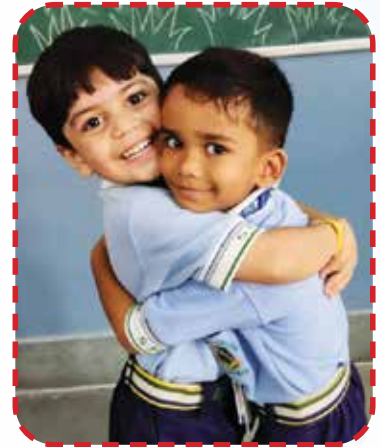
'Friendship is a ship that sails constantly and never reaches a shore.'

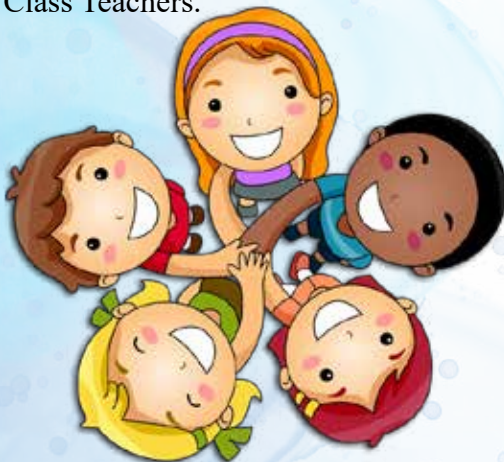
The judges for the Event were Rev. Fr. Anil Abrew, Rev. Fr. Ronald Noronha and Rev. Fr. Sebastian Moses.

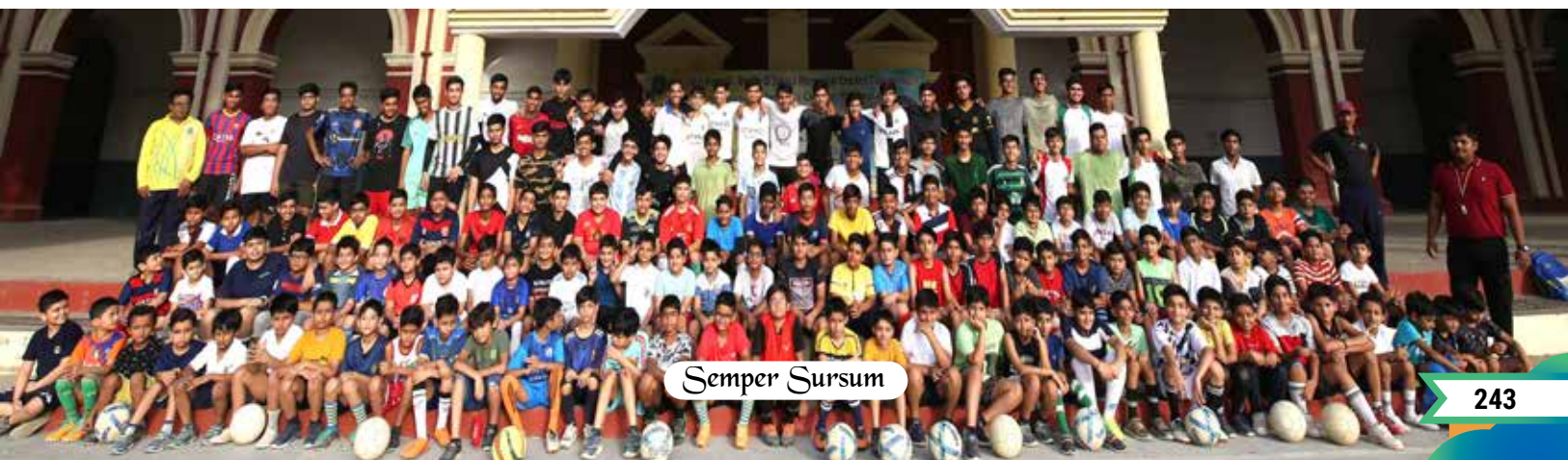

HOW DOES A VIRUS MUTATE?

Viruses can change. They can alter their genetic makeup. When these changes occur, the virus may become more or less of a threat to the human. When a virus infects a host cell, its goal is to replicate itself. The process begins with the copying of genetic material. All viruses are composed of genetic material - they can be made up of DNA or RNA, depending on the genome or the type of viruses. Once a virus invades a host, a human or an animal - usually through the nasal cavity, it binds itself with one of the host cells. The viruses DNA or RNA then infiltrates the cell, where it copies itself, producing more of the virus. That new virus then leaves the cell searching for another cell to infect. Once the virus successfully replicates itself and hijacks a sufficient number of cells without being detected by the antibodies in your body. That's how one gets infected.

Rev. Fr. Aloysius Rego

The Visionary Headmaster



Fr. A. G. Rego is to be remembered as a multi-faceted personage of great attainments in the field of Education. He was a man with a vision, truly national in its dimensions.

He was the Headmaster of St. Joseph's College, Allahabad from 1967 to 1974. His association with the institution began, however, in 1958. He began as a teacher of English in the senior classes and went on to the headmastership.

Among the most abiding memories of my school days is that of the stocky figure of Fr. Rego, going around the field during the recesses, in a flowing cassock and with a thin cane in hand, looking for mischief-makers, a crowd of prefects following him, and all witnessing the awe that the headmaster commanded, and the magic of things setting themselves right before the swiftly advancing strides of the martinet.

Fr. Rego combined in his wonderful personality the roles of a teacher, a writer, an orator, an educationist and an administrator. He was a visionary having a blue print of the complete and comprehensive education of the students, to prepare them for the larger campus of Life.

It is true that Fr. Rego is best remembered for his magnum opus, the "Aids to English Composition" However, Fr. Rego should, more scrupulously, be remembered for his uniquely ambitious and exemplary efforts at practical lessons to the students in the various aspects of the Indian Constitution, through the media of student-self-government and student-democracy on the campus.

The School was conceived to be a 'State'. The students voted to elect a Parliament through General Election. The three of the four Houses of the School, as parties in the Parliament, formed the Government; one the Opposition.



Fr. Rego, in his capacity as the Headmaster, was the President. His presidential speeches at the beginning of parliamentary sessions, recorded religiously in the annual School Magazines for posterity, are an instructive treat to read for the plans meticulously laid out by the ‘Government’ for the diverse affairs of the School. It stimulates patriotism still to read the invariable salutation of ‘*Jai Hind*’ at the conclusion of these speeches. Incidentally, Fr. Rego’s was the loudest and the clearest voice in any chorus of the National Anthem on the campus.

The importance of Fr. Rego’s experiments in promoting student – democracy in the nursery of the campus, to prepare able citizens and capable parliamentarians for the country’s future, cannot be exaggerated.

Ironically, however, Fr. Rego’s experiment of simulation of the Indian Polity in the School climaxed, in 1973, in the dissolution of the Parliament and imposition of the President’s rule in the face of certain disruptive “pulls” and “pressures” exercised over the School affairs by certain “interested parties”.

Towards the close of my schooling, I had a long correspondence with Fr. Rego. He was then in Kodkani, Karnataka, as Chancellor of the Dioceses of Karwar and parish priest of a small Church there. In his first letter to me, dated September 13, 1979, he wrote thus of his last days in St. Joseph’s, Allahabad, “When I was Headmaster of SJC, I went all out to raise standards in every sphere and I did succeed in putting the College on the educational map, though some found me strict, demanding and authoritarian. But I always had the good of the College, of the staff and of the students at heart and I laboured sincerely and devotedly. When I realised that my health was breaking down under the strain of destructive criticism and cruel opposition – I resigned. But God never forsakes those who serve others unselfishly.”

Indeed, God never forsook this great man of service, even in the life’s eventide. In a faltering hand, due to failing health, he concluded his last letter, dated January 3, 1982, thus -- “I am constantly falling ill due to my weak heart. But I carry on working. I have 36 poor children to feed, clothe and educate. They are shaping up well and I feel I am preparing them for a better and a brighter future.”

Through his legacy of letters and lessons, Fr. Rego is still carrying on. He still has legions to intellectually feed, clothe and educate. Those under his care continue to shape up well. For, it is *he* who is preparing them for a better and a brighter future.

THE THEORY OF EVERYTHING

The Theory of Everything is an overarching hypothetical framework that would explain everything of the entire cosmos in a single equation.

Albert Einstein, in his last few years of life, was in search of a theory that would explain everything in the cosmos from expanding matter to the fate of the universe. Some physicists believe they are now on the verge of having a single theory that will unite all of Science under one mathematical equation. In particular, this theory would unify the two great theories of the twentieth century - the General Theory of Relativity and the Quantum Theory. Since General Relativity describes the structure and dimension of the universe, and Quantum Theory describes the microscopic structures, thus the unification of these theories would explain both the very big and the very small. This theory is often referred to as a “*Theory of Everything*” or “*The Ultimate Theory*”.

In particular, this theory would unify our understanding of all the fundamental physical forces in our universe. There are four such forces that physicists know of : gravity, the electromagnetic force, the weak nuclear force (which acts inside the atomic nucleus), and the strong nuclear force (which holds together the protons and neutrons in the atomic nucleus). At the moment, physicists have separate theories for each of these forces but they want one unified theory for all four. That goal has partly been realised in

that they now have a theory which unifies two of these forces - the electromagnetic and weak force (Electroweak Theory) but unifying all four, is proving to be extremely difficult.

When physicists find this theory, it is suggested that Physics will have effectively achieved its end. Now the entire physical universe would be encompassed by a set of equations or perhaps just one equation. But the question would still remain, what would that equation mean?
