The Association serves as a vital intellectual confluence, functioning as a preparatory locus for aspiring journalists and a critical instrument for all students seeking to elevate their command of the written word. The responsibility for the Association’s administration and the stewardship of its crucial reportorial functions was formally conferred upon me for the academic year, following the trust reposed by Dr. V. Deb to uphold the high standards of this prestigious body.

Our primary operational brief—the meticulous documentation of all significant institutional events—was executed with unwavering diligence. This reporting encompassed a distinguished portfolio of major campus happenings, including, but not limited to, the esteemed Frank Anthony Memorial All-India Inter-School Debate, the Inter-School G7 Summit, the cultural spectacle of JOSEPHEST, and the traditionally venerable 141st Annual Athletic Meet. The resulting reportage was disseminated bi-lingually in both the English and Hindi vernaculars. This structure was designed to afford a holistic assessment of general academic competence, integrating core cognitive domains such as Mathematics, Natural Sciences, English Language, and Logical Reasoning, alongside stream-specific components for our senior cohort.
